10:20 – 10:50 am	Translating Benchmarks to Staffing Models Speaker: Margaret Head, RN, MSN, MBA, Vice President, Clinical Operations, Houston Methodist Physician Organization
	Developing clinical team models in the ambulatory setting is an ongoing challenge. No standard staffing model or nurse: patient ratio currently exists across the industry. However, organizations are beginning to determine methods of measuring anticipated workload and resulting allocation of nurse staffing. Current findings in

the literature, as well as anecdotal observations, will be discussed. The Houston Methodist Physician Organization Primary Care Group is using Lean/Six Sigma tools to identify standard work and key workload drivers that will be used as a model across the primary care practices. This project will be used as an example of how to approach the process of setting a staffing model and will launch the roundtable discussions.

Hybrid Ambulatory Practice Nurse Model

Speaker: Cynthia Griffin, MS, BSN, RN, CPHQ, CCM, NEA-BC, Chief Nursing Officer, Community Care, Christiana Care Health System

Uneven distribution of nursing resources, competing demands on nurses, nurses not working at the top of license due to staffing shortages, compensation competitiveness, work-life balance needs, coupled with financial constraints and insufficient access to providers has led ChristianaCare to rethink its approach to staffing nurses in an ambulatory setting.

The goal of the project is to standardize the role of nurses and how nurses are staffed in ambulatory settings. By standardizing the nursing roles, changing reporting structures and introducing new staffing models, we expect the following outcomes:

- Increase nurse capacity to provide seamless, whole person care.
- Bring joy back to nurses' work.
- Improve retention and recruitment.
- Improve relationships between the care teams.
- Increase population health outcomes.
- Increase patient and caregiver satisfaction.
