





Governance: Committee, oversight and preparation

- Why was the committee formed?
- How did we choose who should be the person to lead the efforts? Nursing-Project lead
- How has the process changed over multiple flu seasons?
- What are the lessons learned, recommendations for success?
 - Key stakeholder group is larger than you'd think
 - Redundancy is a good thing

Pop Health

Outreach to high risk populations, home visits to vaccinate

Nursing students trained to assist in phone outreach to managed care patients

Nursing Education

- Ambulatory Leadership team education
- Flu education assigned to all RNs/LVNs/MAs
- Training and observation of Drive Up/MVU staff
- Flu Webinars
- Work with Inpatient Liason to update inpatient education
- Ambulatory website updated

Flu Workgroup

- Validate list of specialty clinics doing vaccination
- Talk with individual operations leaders in clinics where vaccines are not stocked to work through barriers
- Determine when to send bulk MyChart /Well messaging-initial and reminders

Maintenance

- PDSA weekly!
- Record all lessons learned for next season
- Gantt chart helpful
- Trust your subject matter experts
- Learn from national best practices

Clinic based activation: 1 patient at a time (primary

care, specialty)

- Flu Workgroup reach out to clinics to update list of who stocks vaccine, encourage all specialties to consider stocking
- Every patient's vaccination status is reviewed, BPA checked:
 - Have they already received vaccination?
 - Was vaccination received elsewhere? Ensure it is recorded?
 - Is patient refusing to be vaccinated at visit? Postpone vaccination and give patient information on how to be vaccinated in the future.



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Clinic based activation: 1 patient at a time (primary care, specialty)

- Every patient's vaccination status is reviewed every time during flu season, BPA checked:
 - Have they already received vaccination?
 - Was vaccination received elsewhere? Ensure it is recorded?
 - Is patient refusing to be vaccinated at visit? Postpone vaccination and give patient information on how to be vaccinated in the future.

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Peer to Peer program: Employees & occupational health

- Peer to Peer PowerPoint Zoom trainings, recorded version
- How to request vaccines-order just what you need, indicate how many high dose vaccines are needed
- Designate a flu champion in each clinic
- Receiving, storage and documentation of vaccines
- Review of administering vaccine in deltoid
- Skill checkoff document
- Epic Tip Sheet for Peer to Peer Documentation-includes attestation and documentation if received outside UC San Diego Health in MyChart
- Review of dashboard for employee vaccine compliance
- Helpful links to all info

Mass outreach reminders: bulk My Chart messaging (August, December, February)

Criteria for messaging:

- Patient is alive
- 2. Patient is >= 18 yrs of age
- 3. Service Area in EMR is UCSD
- 4. Health Maintenance topic influenza AND is due (criteria 4) AND Return date is >= 8/1/21 [date is hard coded each year!]
- 5. Has UCSD PCP
- 6. Patient's Mychart status is active
- 7. Patient does not have allergy in any of the following AND allergy status is active

Your health is important to us, which is why we are sending you this message. According to our records, you have not received your 2021-22 flu vaccination yet. We are still in the midst of flu season, and we want to remind you that the flu shot can help protect your health.

Schedule Your 2021 Flu Shot Appointment

Drive-up flu shot appointments are available and a convenient way to get vaccinated against the flu. To make an appointment using your MyUCSDChart account, go to Visits, then select "Schedule an Appointment" and "Flu Vaccine (Drive Up)." Unscheduled arrivals will **not** be accepted.

Keep Your Flu Vaccine Status Updated on MyUCSDChart

If you received your flu shot from a provider outside UC San Diego Health, please update your MyUCSDChart account using one of the options below so your doctor knows you're protected from the flu this season:

• You can also reply to this message confirming that you received the vaccine and the approximate date it was received.

If you are not interested in receiving the flu vaccine this season, please reply to this message stating that you are declining the flu vaccine so we can update your records.

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Message on External website in "Flu tab" Patient reported self attestation

If you received your flu shot from a provider outside of UC San Diego Health, please let your doctor know you are vaccinated by updating your records in MyUCSDChart using one of the options below:

- MyUCSDChart for desktop or mobile app From the main page, go to "Menu" and select "Preventive Care." Find "Influenza Vaccine," then select "Mark as complete" and enter your vaccination date on the next screen.
- Send your doctor a MyUCSDChart message -- Let them know you received the vaccine and the approximate date you were vaccinated. If you are declining being vaccinated this season, please let your doctor know with a message as well

 - Hours 8-6pm Mon-Saturday
 - Observation areas with RN, Emergency Kit
- LVNs and lead RN at each site
- Self-scheduled nurse visits in Primary Care Clinics, Pharmacies


What about mix/match (COVID + Influenza)







- Focus on Lowest Quartile of the Healthy Places Index


Figure 1: UCSDH Mobile Vaccine Unit, by Healthy Places Quartile, internal data March 2022
