

"Leveraging Community Health Workers to Improve Immunization Rates"

The May webinar will feature Sarah Arthur, MSW, LCSW, the director of Community Health at Novant Health. Novant launched its Community Health Worker (CHW) program in 2019, aiming to reduce healthcare disparities by connecting under-resourced patients with health and social services. Novant has CHWs in acute, ambulatory and community settings. Sarah will be joined by Grisel Cisneros, MPH, and Marlen Ramirez, CHWI, CHW, CCPST from Vaccinate Your Family (VYF). VYF, a partner of RIZE, also understands the importance of utilizing CHWs to increase access to vaccines. That's why VYF hosts a free training series for CHWs to become "Vaccination Community Navigators" and learn how to encourage vaccination in their communities and navigate people to services.

Resource of the Month

May is Hepatitis Awareness Month, a dedicated time to raise awareness about the importance of hepatitis testing, vaccination, and timely treatment.

In honor of this month, we have developed a new hepatitis B resource, "Why Prioritize the Hepatitis B Vaccine?" This factsheet dispels many common myths surrounding hepatitis B and hepatitis B vaccination in adults. It also provides important information to share with fellow providers and staff, including the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices' (ACIP's) move from a risk-based to routine age-based hepatitis B vaccination recommendation in adults. As of 2022, the ACIP recommends the hepatitis B vaccination for all adults aged 19–59 years and those 60 years and older with risk factors. In addition, per the ACIP, adults >60 years of age without risk factors may also be vaccinated against hepatitis B.
