#### **NEJM** and CIDRAP launch new public health publication.

- The New England Journal of Medicine (NEJM) and the Center for Infectious Disease Research and Policy (CIDRAP) are partnering to <u>launch a new publication</u>.
- The new open-access publication, titled *Public Health Alerts*, will "disseminate essential data on disease outbreaks and other issues of public health importance."
- Publication is expected next month with distribution as needed (rather than weekly).

# High-dose flu vaccine is better than standard regimen at preventing hospitalizations.

• <u>Combined results</u> from two large real-world trials of a high-dose influenza vaccine have found the higher dose provides superior protection against influenza compared to the standard regimen and is better at preventing hospitalizations.

## **NEJM** publishes VIP article on evidence base for 2025-2026 respiratory immunizations.

- Vaccine Integrity Project's (VIP) article, "<u>Updated Evidence for 2025–2026 COVID-19, RSV, and Influenza Immunizations</u>," presents a systematic review of the safety, vaccine effectiveness, and epidemiology of the three key respiratory viruses.
- Where applicable, it also includes meta-analyses of relevant outcomes.

#### U.S. measles cases continue to surpass 30-year high.

• As of Oct. 24, total U.S. measles cases reached <u>1,621</u>. This year has seen the highest number of measles cases since 1992.
